Wilmer Scores

Wilmer, Cutler & Pickering partners P.J. Mode and Dave Donovan won a \$30 million summary judgment on behalf of the Jack Kent Cooke estate last week in a case in which they were opposed by Boies, Schiller & Flexner, the firm of David Boies of *Microsoft* fame. The decision, issued Oct. 27 by Judge Claude Hilton of the Eastern District of Virginia, puts to rest the lengthy battle between the estate and Howard Milstein, the New York real-estate mogul who was represented by Boies, Schiller after his failed attempt last year to buy the Redskins for \$800 million. Hilton ruled that the estate could keep Milstein's \$30 million deposit. "We're always delighted to win, particularly in a big case like this one," Mode says. Jonathan Schiller of Boies, Schiller says Milstein plans to appeal. A suit against John Kent Cooke is still pending. —TATIANA BONCOMPAGNI
