The US Supreme Court recently decided another important pair of property rights cases. *Nautilus v. Biosig Instruments* concerns definiteness and the scope of patents. In *Limelight Networks v. Akamai Technologies*, the Court held that a defendant is not liable for inducing infringement under 35 U.S.C. § 271(b) when no one has directly infringed under Section 217(a) or any other statutory provision.
