

The World Trade Institute's Doctoral Programme Conference: Examining the Role of the State in Investor-State Arbitration

NOVEMBER 8, 2013

The World Trade Institute's first-ever Doctoral Programme Conference, held on 8 November, took as its theme the concept of the "State" in the controversial area of investor-State arbitration. What is the role of the State in this context and what are its rights and responsibilities? These were questions grappled with by top-ranking international speakers, researchers and practitioners, at the one-day event sponsored by the Swiss State Secretariat for Economic Affairs (SECO).

The event was organised jointly by Doctoral Programme Director Shaheezah Lalani and Doctoral Fellow Rodrigo Polanco alongside Stephen Gelb, director of the International Investment Initiative (I3) – WTI's programme on the economics, law and regulation of cross-border direct investment.

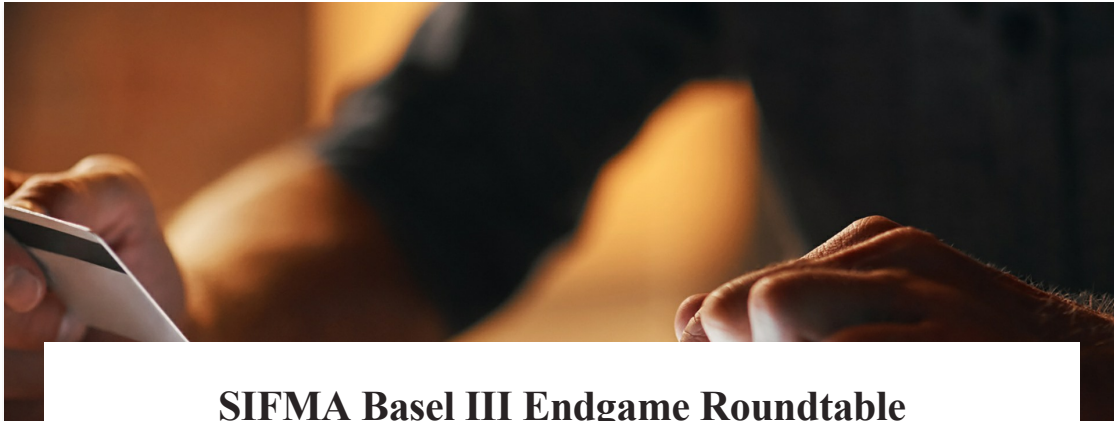
