

Daniel Costelloe Earns Prestigious Young Scholar Award

WilmerHale Senior Associate Daniel Costelloe, a London-based member of the International Arbitration Group, has been awarded the 2016 International and Comparative Law Quarterly (*ICLQ*) Young Scholar Prize for his article "Treaty Succession in Annexed Territory."

The prize is awarded annually to the best article by a scholar aged 35 or under. It is supported by Cambridge University Press, which publishes *ICLQ*.

Costelloe's article explores the question of whether the territorial application of a treaty extends to unlawfully annexed territory. The article concludes that, while in some cases there is scope to find that a treaty applies extraterritorially in annexed territory, notably as a result of its object and purpose or its provisions, there may also be room, subject to the provisions of the treaty, for a limited form of treaty succession in such territory.
