She was previously Deputy Assistant Attorney General for the Antitrust Division of the US Department of Justice, and has spent more than 35 years focused on antitrust litigation, civil and criminal investigations and merger review. Boast was previously named to *GCR*'s Women in Antitrust 2013 list, and has been recognized for her antitrust work by *The Legal 500* and *Best Lawyers in America*.

Nyong'o heads WilmerHale's California cartel practice and joined the firm's Palo Alto office in 2014. She was previously a trial attorney in the Antitrust Division of the US Department of Justice in San Francisco. Nyong'o was named to *GCR*'s 40 Under 40 list of top young antitrust practitioners in 2015, and was highlighted in by the *GCR* 100 guide to the world's leading competition law practices earlier this year.
