Raviv is a lecturer in law at the University of Pennsylvania Law School and he has authored many pieces that have appeared in the Harvard Law Review, Harvard International Law Journal, University of Pennsylvania Journal of Constitutional Law, George Mason Law Review, George Washington International Law Review, Corporate Counsel, Arbitration International, Global Arbitration Review, Transnational Dispute Management, Yearbook on Arbitration and Mediation, and Critical Review of International Social and Political Philosophy.

Raviv is a winner of the American Society of International Law's Private International Law Prize and his article "Unsafe Harbors: Partisan Redistricting and One Person, One Vote" was cited in a Supreme Court opinion in *League of United Latin American Citizens v. Perry* (2006).
