

Firm Receives Legal Aid Society's Pro Bono Publico Award

On November 19, WilmerHale was among 43 law firms to receive the 2012 Pro Bono Publico Award for outstanding service to the Legal Aid Society and its clients.

In addition, Partner Michael Bongiorno, former Senior Associates Sarah Mohr and Keith Bradley, and former Associate Jing-Li Yu, were recognized for their work advocating for New York's homeless population. WilmerHale represented the Coalition for the Homeless and partnered with the Legal Aid Society to challenge a new policy and procedure that the city had adopted for screening homeless individuals seeking shelter. The policy, if successfully implemented, could have deprived thousands of homeless individuals of life-sustaining shelter. The team persuaded a trial court to vacate the policy and are currently litigating the city's appeal of the trial court's decision.

The work that our colleagues have done in the Coalition for the Homeless litigation is a stellar example of our firm's impressive commitment to pro bono work, and we are very proud of them and all that they have achieved," said former Partner Doug Curtis, vice chair of the Legal Aid Society.
