 Practice, will discuss the rise of private damages actions in Europe on a panel from 10:45
 a.m.-noon, titled "Litigation Wave Crosses the 'Pond': What are the Ripples?"
- Partner Jamie Gorelick (DC), a former Deputy Attorney General of the United States, will join a panel from 3:15–5:15 p.m. to discuss "The ABA's 2012 Changes in Ethics Rules." Ms. Gorelick co-chaired the ABA's Commission on Ethics 20/20 and will discuss the Commission's proposed amendments to the ABA Model Rules of Professional Responsibility, which were recently approved by the ABA.

 will co-moderate the traditional "Hot Topics" panel discussion from 3:15–5 p.m.
