

Gen-Probe Walks Away with Patent Victory

WilmerHale won a significant case for client Gen-Probe Incorporated when the US Court of Appeals for the Federal Circuit affirmed that a patent owned by plaintiff-appellant, Enzo Biochem, Inc., was invalid under the on-sale bar.

The patent at issue claimed compositions and methods related to DNA assays, specific to the detection of gonorrhea. The Court held that a contract between Enzo and another company—under which Enzo was obligated to provide that company with a percentage of its requirements for gonorrhea-specific DNA assays—constituted a "commercial offer for sale" under the relevant statute, and that Enzo's DNA assay was "ready for patenting" more than one year before it filed its patent application.
