In addition to her momentous pro bono work, Conley represents major corporations, educational institutions, nonprofit entities, and quasi-governmental entities before federal and state courts and in arbitrations. She has represented clients in civil litigation and government investigations involving regulatory regimes such as the Fair Housing Act, the Equal Credit Opportunity Act, Title IX and the False Claims Act.
