WilmerHale Partner [Kimberly Parker](#) has been named one of the 45 leading women lawyers under 45 years of age in the January 2011 issue of *The American Lawyer*. This issue of the magazine profiles each of the 45 women, recognizing significant achievements at a notably young age.

Parker is a partner in WilmerHale’s Litigation/Controversy Department, a member of the Investigations and Criminal Litigation Practice Group, and co-chair of the firm’s Pro Bono and Community Service Committee. She joined the firm in 1998.

The methodology of *The American Lawyer’s* “45 Under 45” contest included a call for nominations from various industry sources and *The Am Law* 200 firms, with a maximum of five nominations per firm. This was followed by an initial round of vetting and each finalist being screened via phone by an *American Lawyer* reporter, who reviewed each nominee’s record and called clients and opposing counsel.
