
The Washington Post Recognizes WilmerHale Among Top Workplaces for Second Consecutive Year

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For the second consecutive year, WilmerHale's Washington DC office has been recognized among the region's Top Workplaces by *The Washington Post*. A total of 150 companies were honored on one of three lists based on headcount: large, midsize and small workplaces. One of only five law firms listed and the only law firm listed within the large workplace category, WilmerHale ranked eighth out of a total of 25 companies.
