WilmerHale Awarded One of National Law Journal's Pro Bono Awards

The *National Law Journal* selected WilmerHale as one of only four law firms to receive a 2006 Pro Bono Award. Seth Waxman, David Ogden, and Danielle Spinelli were honored for their work in the *Roper v. Simmons* case, which was one of the most important death penalty cases in recent history argued successfully before the US Supreme Court.

The feature article in the *National Law Journal* describes how the WilmerHale team of three lawyers became involved in the case of a juvenile client on death row in the state of Missouri. Jennifer Herndon, a solo practitioner who was appointed to represent juvenile client, Christopher Simmons, against a death penalty sentence, sought out WilmerHale's assistance when the case ended up at the Supreme Court.
