We have advised tribes in connection with historic negotiations to increase tribal sovereignty and self-determination, and in securing approvals for the development of resorts and renewable energy and oil and gas facilities on federal lands. We have direct experience working with high-level federal agencies and have successfully managed many relationships between tribes and federal agencies, brokering mutually advantageous outcomes. Our regulatory lawyers work closely with the firm's Native American Law team, which advises tribal governments on difficult or unsettled legal questions and advocates for the rights of tribes in complex litigation.
