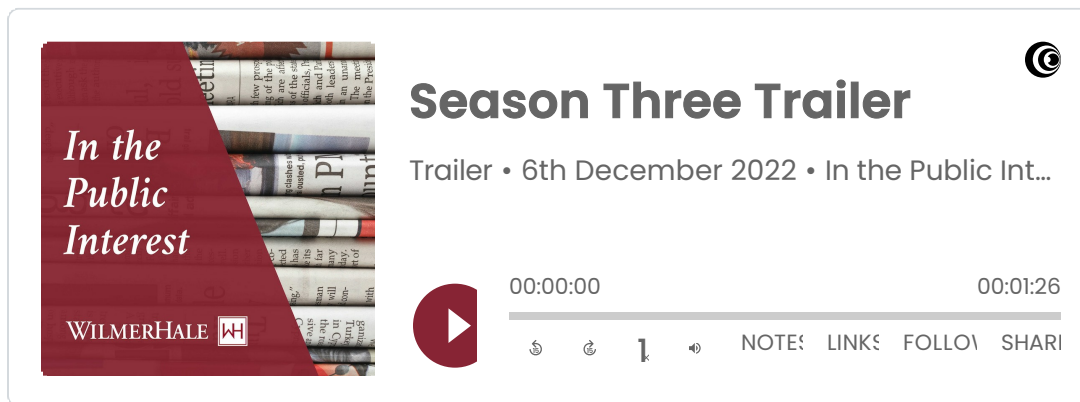


Season Three Trailer
